After logging in, authors have to follow the **Submit New Manuscript** link, then enter the title of their contribution and select **Special Issue: TRISTAN** for the article type. Authors will be guided stepwise through the creation and uploading of the various files. All correspondence, including notification of the editor's decision and requests for revision, takes place by e-mail. A printed copy of the manuscript is not required at any stage of the process. The usual standards of the journal apply to the special issue, as well as the reviewing process.
